Holistic Mission in Practice



Localizing Mission in PCVEA Institutions:

- **Onesua Presbyterian College (Efate):** Combining academic excellence with spiritual discipleship and community life.
- **Tata Presbyterian College (Santo):** Cultivating moral integrity and practical skills in rural boarding contexts.
- **Malasitabu school (Port Vila):** Serving urban youth with holistic Christian values amidst rapid social change.
- **Community Renewal:** Transforming surrounding villages through student outreach and servant leadership.

Strengthening school principals, head teachers, and staff with servant-leadership training, administrative skills, and spiritual mentoring.

Providing regular administrative workshops and leadership retreats to support school managers across all six provinces.

Establishing standardized financial reporting, transparent resource allocation, and ethical governance practices.

Connecting parish pastors, elders, and school councils to ensure shared vision and active spiritual care for students.

Broadening educational access across island communities while securing church assets and building sustainable networks.

3. Inclusive & Expanded Growth

Broadening Educational Pathways

PCVEA is committed to expanding access across the full learning continuum—from Early Childhood Care & Education (ECCE) to Secondary cycles and Technical & Vocational Education and Training (TVET).

By revitalizing sites like the **Epule Education Centre, Talua Theological Training Institute (TTTI), Korvan Community Health school (KCHS)**, PCVEA creates vital vocational pathways for youth, ensuring practical trade skills, climate resilience, and sustainable livelihoods across island presbyteries.



Broadening Educational Pathways



✓ **Early Childhood Care & Education (ECCE):** Establishing strong foundational Christian learning in early years across all presbyteries from Torba to Tafea.

→ **Secondary Education Expansion:** Upgrading academic programs and boarding facilities at Onesua, Tata, Vaum, Nabangasale, William's Bay and other PCVEA administered boarding schools to accommodate growing student populations.

★ **Vocational & TVET Integration:** Developing practical trade skills, agriculture, and hospitality training linked with church and community needs (e.g. Onesua Presbyterian school).

📌 **Equitable Island Access:** Ensuring remote island communities in Malekula, Ambrym, Tanna, and Santo have equal access to quality PCVEA schools.

Collaborating with global Presbyterian churches, mission partners, YWAM, and community bodies for strategic resourcing and prayer support.
